Epiphany Celebration Tonight!

You know that the Wise Men brought gifts to the Christ Child; but do you know that they were given, not on Christmas Day, but on Epiphany, TODAY, the 12th day after Christmas – (12 drummers drumming). We celebrate it beginning with a potluck dinner that includes a special dessert. After dinner, three special one's - Wise Ones – lead the group through the darkened church building – guided by a few battery-powered candles – to locate the star over the baby in the manger. When we find the baby, we, like the Wise Men before us, will worship him. This is a great family event – kids love the search for the baby through the dark church. It is also a way to express Christmas beyond the presents and the tree. **The dinner is at 5:00 pm and we are finished by 7:00 pm.**

Second Wednesday Bible Study – January 9th

Each month Rev. Judy leads a Bible Study on the Second Wednesday. We gather in the Health Ministry office and read scripture together. Rev. Judy provides some context and history. As a group, we raise questions about the meaning and talk about what implications God's word has for our lives. Each month is a stand-alone study, so you can come without fear of being behind. This month we will look at the book of Proverbs – not all of it. Proverbs is an interesting collection of statements about daily life that are applicable today as they were 2,000 years ago. Join us. We meet at 7:00 pm and end promptly at 8:30.
