Children are always welcome in the sanctuary! We appreciate the sounds of little ones among us. If you'd prefer, there are trained caregivers in our nursery on the floor beneath the sanctuary. Ask a greeter if you need help finding it.

There is also a comfortable room with water, sofas, chairs, carpet and a video link to the service for when you need more room to attend to your family. It is located just outside the doors to the right of the front chancel area.

### Children (Stepping Stones) and Youth Church School

Classes for children and youth in pre-k through 12th grade are taught during worship. Families begin the worship service together in the sanctuary. Children are then invited to join us at the front (if they are comfortable) for the Time for the Young. Afterwards, the children and youth are led to their classrooms by their teachers.

Let us pray to God, the Mother of Mercies, the Father of Graces, for the unity and mission of God's church, that it may welcome and serve all people especially those among us who suffer with mental illness: ***R: God in your mercy, hear our prayer.***

Guide us the citizens and leaders of this nation, this state, this city, that we may come together to provide for and protect the poor, the homeless and those who suffer in body, mind and spirit. ***R: God in your mercy, hear our prayer.***

Forgive us, O God, when we knowingly or unknowingly ridicule, look in disgust, neglect or discriminate against those who are mentally ill. ***R: God in your mercy, hear our prayer.***

Comfort and relieve those who are troubled in mind and spirit; bring them hope peace and the consolation of a loving community. ***R: God in your mercy, hear our prayer.***

Grant patience and courage to the families and friends of those who are ill. Increase their perseverance as they face challenges of recovery for their loved one. ***R: God in your mercy, hear our prayer.***

Protect and defend those living with mental illness from exploitation, addiction and abuse. ***R: God in your mercy, hear our prayer.***

Walk with the homeless and missing persons, those who are destitute and have few around them who care. ***R: God in your mercy, hear our prayer.***

For the families who have lost a loved one to mental illness through suicide, give them comfort in trusting that your grace accepts their beloved one despite the final desperate act that lead to their loss. ***R: God in your mercy, hear our prayer.***
